REPORT OF 2017 SEASON

The 2017 season of the Quebec Cricket Federation started on the weekend of May 27-28 and concluded on the weekend of September 16, with our League Divisional Championships and Knock-Out Finals in both 35 overs and T20 formats.

The Premier was structured in one pool for 35 over format and 2 pools for 20 over format.

The A Division was structured into 1 Conference for 20 over format and 2 Conferences each in 35 over format.

High Performance & Selection Camps - for our Seniors and Juniors were held during the off-season to select and prepare the selected players for Provincial representation.

Eastern T-20 - Quebec participated in the Eastern T20 and ended up as Runners up to Nova Scotia. Due to the realigned distribution of financial support from Cricket Canada helped in reducing the strain on our budget for participating in this tournament.

Confederation Cup – Once one of the most anticipated events of our cricket season but not competed for over the past several years was again re-established with great anticipation, 3 teams - Seniors, Juniors and Masters (over 50) travelled to Ottawa for a great day of cricket and renewing of acquaintances, thanks to OVCC for their kind hospitality as we look forward to reciprocating on their visit to Montreal in 2018.

Junior cricket: - Our Junior cricket continues to grow although it being with some difficulty in keeping many of our youngsters after they have reached the legal working age, efforts will be made in trying to keep them in the fold. Many of our youngsters have put in a lot of effort and commitment in improving their cricket skills. During the regular season, our more experienced junior players were allowed the freedom to play with any senior club of their choice in order to gain more experience.

School Cricket – We introduced cricket to Barclay Elementary School, had four 2 hr, sessions and then an actual game at Parc Jarry where the parents attended and participated.

BEDCL – after many years of trying, BEDCL visited Montreal in early June, the weather while not being perfect did allow for two T20 games, Quebec won both games quite easy; it was a welcome visit due to absence of visits from teams from Toronto in recent years. Gone are the days of the Atholston Trophy and John Ross Robertson tournaments which gave many of our top players the opportunity to compete more often against teams from Central Ontario.

Central T20 – we welcomed the invitation to compete in the Central T20, our results were not as expected but our lads returned with renewed vigour to continue to improve.

We would once again like to thank Cricket Canada for their assistance throughout the past year and look forward to their continuing support.
